1. Basic Features of a Man (Alphabetical Order)

1. **Aggressiveness** – A forceful or confrontational approach to situations.
2. **Altruism** – Prioritizing the needs of others over one's own.
3. **Ambition** – A strong drive to achieve goals and success.
4. **Anxiety** – Persistent worry or fear about uncertain situations.
5. **Arrogance** – An exaggerated sense of self-importance or superiority.
