

President Richard Nixon: A Balanced Legacy (with Impact Ratings)

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Personal Introduction

For me Nixon was always a tragic figure, who was unfairly treated by the media and political establishment, which eventually forced him to resign. The fact that he did resign, elevated him in my eyes and, at the same time, reinforced my sense that something wrong was done to him.

There were some suggestions that the entire media was attacking him relentlessly while he had very limited tools to defend himself – Internet and social media were not there yet, the tools that helped Mr. Trump to successfully defend himself in the face of multiple attacks by the media, sometimes fair and sometimes - flagrantly political.

So, here I am trying to build up his record of accomplishments both on the international and local arenas. My understanding is that this list has many accomplishments that left fundamental, long range positive imprint on the fabric of domestic and international life and interactions.

This attempt is to create a minimally biased analysis, trying to screen out many years of accumulated, mostly negative, narrative.

The following metric is used for the analysis.

Rating scale: Each policy or action is evaluated on a scale from -100 (extreme failure) to +100 (transformative success). Ratings are based on scope of impact, longevity of effects, and historical significance. Domestic and international items are considered within their own domains.

I. Domestic Achievements

- **Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), 1970 [+95]:** Landmark agency with enduring bipartisan support and lasting national impact on public health and environmental standards.
- **Clean Air Act (1970) and Clean Water Act amendments (1972) [+90]:** Strong and effective legislation with sweeping environmental benefits. Central to federal environmental regulation.
- **Wage and Price Controls (1971) [+25]:** Short-term relief from inflation, but harmful distortions over time.

- **End of the Gold Standard (1971, "Nixon Shock") [+75]:** Revolutionized global monetary systems; controversial, but ultimately pivotal for modern economics.
- **Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) [+90]:** Long-lasting institution improving workplace safety for millions of American workers.
- **Accelerated Desegregation of Southern Schools [+90]:** Underappreciated but effective enforcement of civil rights through federal leverage.
- **Proposed Family Assistance Plan (FAP) [+50]:** Forward-thinking welfare reform idea that failed in Congress, but showed policy imagination.
- **Supplemental Security Income (SSI) [+75]:** Longstanding income support program for vulnerable populations. Quietly impactful.

II. International Achievements

- **1972 Visit to China and Normalization of Relations [+100]:** One of the most geopolitically transformative acts of the century. Realigned global power structure.
- **Détente and Strategic Arms Limitation Talks (SALT I) [+95]:** First serious arms control agreement with USSR; reduced Cold War tensions.
- **Vietnamization Policy [+60]:** Reduced U.S. casualties and helped withdraw American forces, but did not prevent ultimate collapse of South Vietnam.
- **Paris Peace Accords (1973) [+60]:** Ended direct U.S. military involvement, though failed to produce durable peace. Mixed success.
- **Support for Israel in the Yom Kippur War (1973) [+80]:** Strategic decision that strengthened U.S.-Israel relations and solidified U.S. role as key Middle East actor.

III. Domestic and Foreign Policy Failures (Excluding Watergate)

- **Economic Stagflation [-40]:** Failed to control inflation and unemployment simultaneously. Led to long-term economic stagnation.
- **Expansion of Executive Power [-20]:** Created concern about unchecked presidential authority, weakening democratic norms.
- **Bombing Campaigns in Cambodia and Laos [-60]:** Secretive and destabilizing, with severe humanitarian and geopolitical consequences.

IV. Watergate: Separate Assessment

- **The Scandal [-50]:** Abuse of executive power, obstruction of justice, and loss of public trust. Rightfully condemned.
